Hi, I'm contacting all the parish councils on the West Oxfordshire District Council website list, to tell you about our new West Oxfordshire Takeover programme that goes out on Thursdays at 8pm which you might be interested in. We're looking for more local people to take part across the district in our programme which is aimed at under 50 year olds with features and music that may be of interest to that part of our audience, but it's open to anyone to contribute something appropriate. We'd like to give local people the chance to make their own audio report about the place where they live or work. It could be about a club, sport, hobby, charity or group they are involved with, their job or a local business, a report about an event that's happened or one that's coming up, a celebration of something or someone where they live, a subject they are passionate about which they would like to share with a wider audience, or anything else you can think of that might be appropriate to talk about on the radio!

It's more of a celebration of where we live rather than about something really newsy or controversial which our daytime programmes might tackle. It has to conform to the usual BBC rules about impartiality and decency and if a particular opinion or view is expressed, we may have to find another person with an alternative view to be fair to the other side and give a balanced report for our listeners.

To make it easy to take part, we are suggesting people make their own two minute takeover recordings on their smartphone voice recorder or tablet audio recorder app, rather than having to come into our studios. Contributors may find it easier to involve another local person and record a chat with them about the subject, write a script or some notes to help them remember what they want to say, or act like a reporter and interview someone. You don't have to do it in a quiet place. We love to paint audio pictures so a little atmosphere and background noise is great, as long as it's not too loud. If you don't have the technology, we may be able to come and visit you instead. Unfortunately we can't accept features containing commercial music but we can sometimes include local music.

If you have an idea or would like to have a go, or you know someone who might like to take part, please share this email and reply to me and we can discuss the report you would like to make. I'd be happy to answer any questions you may have and give you some hints and tips on how to make a good report. I'm usually in the office Tuesday to Fridays from 11am to 3pm on 01865 889022.

I look forward to hearing from you soon.

The Red Lion, Aston was listed as an Asset of Community Value in April 2014 following Aston, Cote, Shifford & Chimney Parish Council's nomination of this property. I am writing to advise that the five year term of this listing will expire on 9 April 2019.

As a result of the end of the current listing term, the property will be removed from the list and it will no longer be subject to the restrictions placed upon it that relate to the status as an Asset of Community Value. The restriction placed upon the title with the Land Registry will be removed, as will the Local Land Charge.

Please note, however, that it is possible for The Red Lion to be nominated afresh as an Asset of Community Value. Such a nomination would be considered without reference to the previous listing decision and the District Council would give notice of any new nomination that it receives.

Arnold Baker Local Council Administration says 'Subject to certain formalities a council may spend in a single financial year up to a prescribed limit for any purpose which in its opinion is in the interests of or will directly benefit the area or its inhabitants, or of part of it, or some of them. The powers of an existing statute must be used if there are any.'
