

## MINUTES OF ASTON, COTE, SHIFFORD & CHIMNEY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON Thursday 20 April 2023 at the Village Hall, Aston, at 7.30pm

- **1. Apologies from Members**: There was an apology from J Ordish.
- **2. Minutes of the previous meeting** of the Parish Council on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2023 and 29<sup>th</sup> March 2023 were agreed it was RESOLVED as proposed by P Sparrowhawk, seconded by R La Forte, with all in agreement, that the Chair signs them.
- **3.** Parish Councillors Disclosure of interests on agenda items R La Forte declared a nonpecuniary interest in agenda item 13 as a Community Trust Trustee.
- 4. Meeting Open for Public Participation

A member of the public, on behalf of the Aston Action Group and Marsh Furlong Housing Group, expressed thanks to the Parish Council for the work that had been done and was ongoing in relation to the planning appeal APP/D3125/W/23/3317512.

- 5. WODC/OCC Matters not in attendance
- 6. Matters Arising from Previous Meetings
  - a) Planning Appeal 22/00986/FUL and APP/D3125/W/23/3317512
     Briefing from the Chairman on the appeal actions to date. Councillors have been briefed in full by email during this process.
    - The Parish Council has been granted Rule 6 status.
    - Statement of Case to be sent to the planning inspector by 28<sup>th</sup> April 2023.
    - 10<sup>th</sup> May case management meeting.
    - 23 May 2023 proofs of evidence and witness statements to be submitted.
    - 20<sup>th</sup> June Planning Enquiry up to 5 days.

It was RESOLVED as proposed by R La Forte, seconded by G Ball, with all in agreement to pay £2,640.95 inclusive of VAT for the engagement of counsel from Landmark Chambers to review the Parish Council's objection and supporting papers for the purpose of giving learned opinion on the merit of pursuing the appeal.



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It was RESOLVED as proposed by R La Forte, seconded by A Chapman, with all in agreement, to pay £1,200 inclusive of VAT on further funding to purchase counsel time, from Landmark Chambers, to review the draft Statement of Claim.

It was RESOLVED, as proposed by R La Forte, seconded by R Anstee, with all in agreement, that the Parish Council would fund up to £5,000 for expert witnesses and legal counsel for the Rule 6 action as part of the Planning Appeal APP/D3125/W/23/3317512.

It was RESOLVED as proposed by B Lings, seconded by G Ball, with all in agreement, to delegate authorisation for funds in the TERRA Earmarked reserve to R La Forte and be retrospectively approved by Parish Council. This being due to requirement to pay expert witnesses and counsel as part of the engagement process.

20.30 hours - R Anstee – Gave his apologies and left the meeting.

- b) 20 mph and changes to the national speed limit between Cote and Aston on B4449

  C Pyne delivered the report he had generated from the consultation he had organised, and this is at Appendix 1. The Chair and those present all thanked him for the works he had done and detailed report he had delivered. There was support for the 20 mph limits from other residents at the meeting and an ad hoc question at the Annual Parish Meeting on the 18<sup>th</sup> April 2023, at which there were 65 residents, indicated a small, but not substantial, majority in favour of the new limits. There was a lengthy debate by councillors on next steps specifically whether to:
  - Stay with the blanket 20 mph speed limits.
  - Revert to the 30-mph speed limits.
  - Propose a hybrid scheme.

It was RESOLVED as proposed by R La Forte, seconded by P Sparrowhawk, with all in agreement, that a hybrid scheme should be requested.

The following amendments to the existing blanket 20 mph scheme were discussed and decided:

It was RESOLVED as proposed by R La Forte, seconded by B Lings, with all in agreement, that the 20 mph should remain in all the sides streets, housing estates and including, Back Lane, Bull Street and Cote.

It was RESOLVED as proposed by B Lings, seconded by G Ball, and carried with a ratio of 3 for with 2 against, to keep the 20 mph from the centre of Aston towards Bampton. It was RESOLVED as proposed by G Ball, seconded by A Chapman, and carried with a ratio of 4 for and 1 abstaining, to keep the 20 mph from the Square in Aston along North Street towards Witney.

It was RESOLVED as proposed by G Ball, seconded by B Lings, and carried with a ratio of 3 for with 2 against, to keep the 20 mph from the Square along Cote Road towards Cote. It was RESOLVED as proposed by B Lings, seconded by A Chapman, with all in agreement to change the 20 mph to 30mph to just before the crossroads and then reduce it to 20mph for the crossroads themselves.

It was RESOLVED as proposed by B Lings, seconded by R La Forte, that the current national speed limit between Cote and Aston on the B4449 be reduced to 30mph.



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It was RESOLVED as proposed by R La Forte, seconded by B Lings, with all in agreement to request that the 20-mph speed limit to be extended past Cote Lodge, Cote as requested by residents.

The clerk to draft a letter to OCC Highways reiterating the concerns raised about the original consultation, the method of implementation without final consultation with the Parish Council and listing the above resolutions.

The clerk to draft a timeline of actions and requests to clarify the process and identify and lessons to be learnt.

#### c) Aston Day Centre Grant Application

It was RESOLVED to make a grant of £500 being as proposed by R La Forte, seconded by B Lings, with all in agreement. The Parish Council is keen to support the Aston and Cote Day centre and requested submission of the audited accounts for 22-23 with a request for further funding.

#### d) Coronation 6th May 2023

The Parish Council is fully supportive of the proposal by the Parochial Church Council to have a 'Book of Congratulation' for the Coronation. The book to be available in St James Church from 1<sup>st</sup> May to 8<sup>th</sup> May and then forwarded to the Palace after the coronation. The format is a wooden covered book with the following wording on the cover:

Messages from the congregation and villagers of St James, Aston, Bampton, Oxfordshire to commemorate the coronation of His Majesty King Charles III and Her Majesty Queen Camilla on Saturday, May 6th 2023 GOD SAVE THE KING

The Chair will sign on behalf of the Parish Council.
